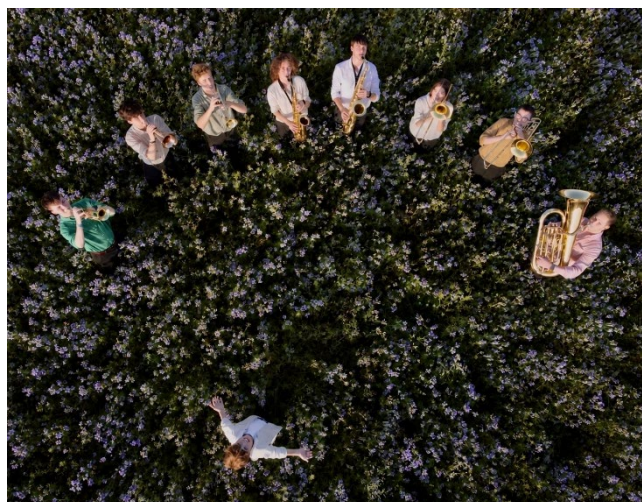

P & Q BAND

Year 8

As pupils move into Year 8 and so are more familiar with the school, they are mixed with others from across the year group for their teaching classes. In order to do this, pupils are placed randomly on the P or Q half of the year. This placement is checked by the Heads of House and the individual learning department to make sure it is appropriate.

This means pupils will not be in their tutor groups for lessons. We do this to allow pupils to develop their social skills (working and interacting with new people) in a controlled classroom environment. Pupils remain in their tutor groups for tutor time and personal development lessons.

Year 9

As pupils move from Year 8 into Year 9 they stay in the same band (P or Q). Within this band the mix of pupils within each class will change based on the learning needs identified by each subject area.

Year 10

For option subjects pupils will be taught in classes made up of pupils from across the Year group based on the options they have selected.

In core subjects, pupils will be mixed with others from the same band they are in (P or Q). Pupils are placed randomly on the P or Q half of the year. This placement is checked by the Heads of House and the individual learning department to make sure it is appropriate. The band they are in this year may be different from last year and this mixing is intentional. This is to allow pupils to develop their social skills (working and interacting with new people) in a controlled classroom environment. Pupils remain in their tutor groups for tutor time and personal development lessons.

We would encourage parents to talk about this with their children over the summer. For most pupils the opportunity to work with a new group of people is exciting but some can be a little nervous.

UCAS convention

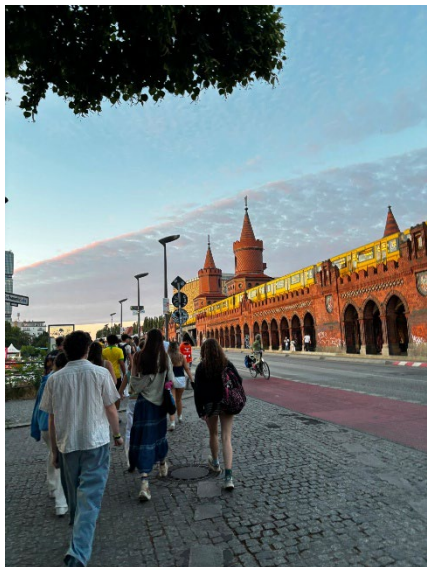

On 30th June, we welcomed 240 Y13 students and 35 staff members to Manor By The Lake for our annual Y13 leavers prom. A truly wonderful evening was had by all, staff and parents joined during arrivals to see our students arrive onto the red carpet and enjoy a welcome lavender mocktail. We then invited guests into the main ballroom for a formal two course sit-down meal. After dinner, we moved outside to a wonderful gazebo area in the beautiful grounds and invited our Y13 prom committee to the microphone to present various awards, as nominated by their peers. We then moved back into the ballroom for some dancing! As always, its a bittersweet evening as we wish our Y13 students farewell!

**Y12 Berlin:**

Whilst lower school were on their activities week, we took 45 Y12 students to Berlin for the week. This is the third year we have run this trip in Sixth Form and each year staff and students have a truly wonderful week! This year we stayed at the Hotel Schultz, located immediately opposite the Berlin wall. During the week we enjoyed a walking tour, boat tour, a very interesting tour of the Templehof airport and the Stasi prison along with a great deal of walking, exploring and travelling on both the U and S bahn trains as well as our transport highlight - trams. We had many lovely meals out including Italian, Indian and probably our favourite - a traditional German schnitzel restaurant. We also took the students to a street food market where they were able to walk around with their friends sampling many different delights! The students were wonderful company and a great week was had by all.



Last week as part of activities week, 27 pupils completed their DofE Gold assessed expedition in Bannau Brycheiniog (Brecon Beacons) National Park. This group of students have been working all year on the 5 elements that make up the DofE gold award; Physical activity, skills, volunteering, residential and expedition.

They then had some training for expedition in school, and then on a rainy weekend down in Dartmoor back in April. This expedition to the Brecon Beacons was the opposite, it was a heatwave, with temperatures reaching to 30C. Day one saw the pupils head out of Hay on Wye and head up to the mountains, going over Twmpa mountain at 690m. Thankfully it was cooler in the hills despite the lack of shade. That evening the campsite was cool and shady, with the chance to cool off by a stream.

To escape the heat the groups set off early the next day, before 6AM, and took routes along the valley and up on to the Offas Dyke Ridge that separates England and Wales. These routes took them down to camp by Llanthony Priory, a 12 Century priory. All groups were out of the sun and making the most of the shade at the campsite by 3PM.



Day three saw the groups take on the longest day, around 24KM, heading up on to the ridge and the highpoint of the expedition at Rhos Dirion (713m). There were multiple water top up spots as the groups completed their own navigation and worked on their project along the way. All of the pupils were glad to get down to the sanctuary of the campsite that evening.

The fourth day of the trip was a loop from Newcourt farm campsite on the foothills of the Brecons, before the groups cleaned their tents and tranguias and headed home. Not before stopping for a well earned feast at KFC on the way back.

Well done to all of the pupils who passed this element of their DofE award, they coped with challenging conditions and weather.

YEAR 7 ENJOY AN UNFORGETTABLE EDUCATIONAL VISIT TO PARIS

Thirty-five Year 7 pupils recently returned from an exciting four-day educational visit to Paris, where they enjoyed a packed programme of cultural, historical and language-based activities.

After crossing the English Channel, pupils began their French adventure with a visit to Nausicaá, Europe's largest aquarium, before travelling on to Paris.

The following days were filled with memorable experiences. Pupils explored the fascinating world of chocolate at Choco-Story, where they learnt about the history of chocolate before taking part in an interactive workshop. They also enjoyed a relaxing cruise along the River Seine, offering spectacular views of some of Paris' most famous landmarks.

One of the highlights of the trip was climbing the 284 steps to the top of the Arc de Triomphe. Pupils were rewarded with breathtaking panoramic views across the French capital and gained a greater appreciation of the city's history and architecture.

A particular favourite was the bakery workshop, where pupils worked alongside Bruno, a professional French baker, to make traditional French bread. What made this experience especially valuable was that Bruno delivered all of his instructions and demonstrations entirely in French. Pupils quickly realised how much classroom language they could understand and were encouraged to listen carefully, respond to questions and follow authentic spoken French in a real-life setting. It was a fantastic opportunity to develop their confidence and see the practical benefits of learning a foreign language.

No visit to Paris would be complete without a day at Disneyland Paris. Pupils thoroughly enjoyed exploring the parks, experiencing the attractions and spending time with their friends, creating memories that will undoubtedly stay with them for years to come.

Travelling abroad encouraged them to develop important life skills, including organisation, teamwork, problem-solving and confidence in unfamiliar surroundings. The pupils embraced every opportunity, whether sampling French cuisine, practising their language skills or discovering the rich culture and history of Paris. The trip was an outstanding success, and it was a pleasure to see how enthusiastically the pupils engaged with every activity.
